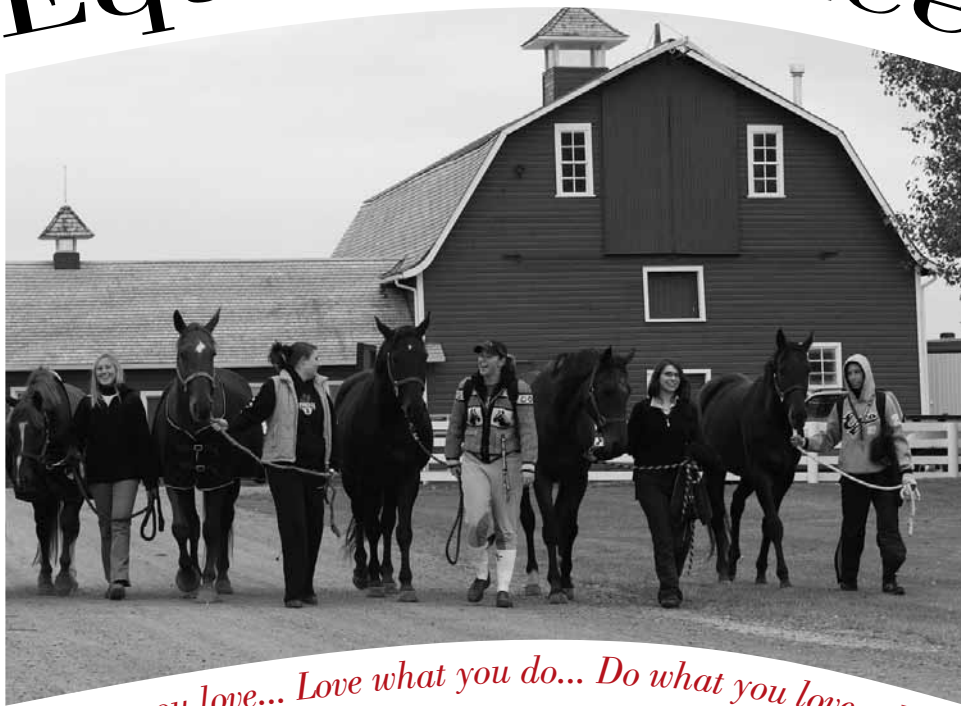

CAREERS WITH HORSES!

Your passion for horses could put you on the fast track to a successful future doing what you love. Right now, Canada's horse related businesses are looking for trained individuals who can provide skill and expertise in all facets of the equine industry. The equine educational opportunities provided by the two year Equine Science diploma program can prepare you to take advantage of these opportunities and to launch your career with horses.

Program Description

The Equine science program offers extensive training in equine science and practical skills leading to employment in the equine industry. The curriculum provides for the development of occupational skills including: care and training of horses, horsemanship, breeding and foaling management, business and event management, instruction of beginning riders and coaching. A valid drivers license is required.

Graduates of the Equine Science program who wish to complete a second major will require a third and possibly a fourth year at Olds College. Completing multiple majors in two years will not be possible in this program due to limited quotas and timetabling restrictions.

Business and Event Management Major

In addition to learning horse husbandry and handling skills, students in this major will receive training in the

business practices associated with the management of an equine related enterprise or an equine focused event. Students will use their knowledge and skills to produce an equine event on the campus. A graduate may enter the industry as a sales and marketing representative, a retail business person, event or competition manager or manager of an equine operation.

Production and Breeding Management Major

This major allows the student to combine the knowledge of horse husbandry and handling with the opportunity to learn and perform the modern techniques used for breeding horses and to manage the foaling mare and newborn foal. Students will gain experience in the management of a

commercial breeding operation by participating in the breeding program at Olds College. Graduates may enter the industry as an assistant breeding farm manager or an owner/operator.

Horsemanship Major

The Horsemanship major gives students the opportunity to improve their riding skills in either the English or Western discipline in addition to learning horse husbandry and handling skills. The focus in this major will be on starting young horses for riding and driving and to train started horses to perform various maneuvers in either English or Western. Graduates may enter the

industry as employees at the boarding or training centers or as an owner/operator.

Equestrian Coaching Major

This major gives students the opportunity to combine horse husbandry and handling with the skills necessary to teach English and/or Western riding to people at a beginner or intermediate level. Students will complete all necessary requirements to receive Equine Canada Instructor certification and possibly Coaching I if desired. Graduates may enter the industry as instructors/coaches at boarding or competition barns or as a self employed instructor/coach.

Admission Requirements

Applicants must have:

- a) High School Diploma or its equivalent
- b) 50% or better in English Language Arts 30-1 or 30-2
- c) 50% or better in Pure or Applied Math 20
- d) 50% or better in Biology 30

Alternate Admissions Status:

Alternate Admissions status will apply for those students that have not achieved the high school diploma admission requirement. The applicant must meet all academic course requirements and complete the volunteer and/or paid work experience hours.

All majors require a minimum of 150 hours of substantiated work experience in a related horse operation other than one owned by the applicant's family. The work experience verification form must be completed by the employer/employers and returned to Olds College prior to March 1st for Fall entry. (Forms will be supplied by the Registrar's office after application to Olds College.)

Admission into the Equine Science program is on a competitive basis. Applications will be prescreened and those meeting the minimum requirements are invited

to the College for testing. All applicants will take the same test which consists of a riding component and a practical component. (To be held each spring for entry into the program in the fall of the same year.) Please note that only qualified applicants will be tested. We will contact applicants by letter as to their specific test date and time.
