Equine Care & Management Certificate

1	<p>EQN 1005 - Equine Terminology</p> <p>Students will develop an understanding of terms used in the equine industry, including anatomy and equipment, so graduates can confidently, accurately, and professionally interact with various stakeholders in the equine industry.</p>
2	<p>EQN 1015 - Equine Behaviour and Horsemanship</p> <p>Students will learn how to interpret and interact with horses exhibiting different behaviors so that both horse and student can be safe, stay in a state of low stress, and grow in their interactions with one another. Students will apply their knowledge of equine behaviour to determine individual care and herd management practices.</p>
3	<p>EQN 1025 - Introduction to Careers in the Equine Industry</p> <p>Students will explore the various opportunities available across the many different disciplines in the equine industry. This course will provide students with an understanding of the business aspects of equine related businesses and facilities.</p>
4	<p>EQN 2015 - Equine Husbandry and Facility Design</p> <p>Students will learn about husbandry and facility design and how those two factors impact equine health and safety. They will analyze an equine facility and make recommendations to improve husbandry and design to increase health and safety for the horse while considering cost impacts.</p>
