3. NEW BUSINESS - CURRICULUM APPROVAL

3.1. School of Life Science and Business

3.1.1. <u>New Course Outline - SPM 1050 - Contemporary Issues in Sports Management (D.Bullock)</u>

• In 2021, the Business Management Diploma - Sports Management Major underwent a comprehensive program review. The PCC has been diligently working through the Action Plan, resulting in several changes to the Program of Study. Resulting from comments

related to changes and priorities within the sports industry, and reflecting the comments of both students and faculty in the review, we have added Contemporary Issues in Sports Management to the Sports Management Diploma, replacing HAT 2355.

- **3.1.2.** <u>Course Revision HRT 2450 Horticulture Field Production</u> (D.Bullock)
 - Changes will allow the course to better align with prerequisite course material (HRT 1700), as well as reflect a more balanced coverage of the overall competencies. These changes must be in effect for the winter term because in its current state, the course (which has never been offered previously) doesn't align with the HRT 1700 material. The students who will be enrolled in this course, have already had the prerequisite course and must have the revised material of HRT 2450.

- **3.2.5.** <u>Program Revision Bachelor of Digital Agriculture</u> (J.Benkie)
 - The Bachelor of Digital Agriculture degree, in alignment with the Canadian Degree Qualifications Framework, includes Program Learning Outcomes that require students to demonstrate the capacity to accomplish independent scholarly work. The intentional design of the programming promotes a pedagogy that empowers learners as problem-solvers; where they will have experience and opportunity in applying theoretical concepts to real-world issues in Agriculture. Through the development of foundational knowledge and the subsequent development of the skills and mindsets aforementioned, students will engage in a project-based learning experience, both individually and in teams, aimed at preparing them to be responsive decision-makers within the Agriculture industry. This program proposal presents an updated view of program sequencing based on the developed program curriculum map and course development. It also represents consistent feedback from multiple stakeholder groups through the internal Olds College process as well as through the Ministry of Advanced Education System Review process where 26 Alberta Post Secondary Institutions have the ability to provide feedback. Olds College received feedback from 8 Alberta Post Secondary Institutions during the system review process in 2019 and subsequent to that time we have been engaged with Campus Alberta Quality Council to ensure alignment with the Canadian Degree Qualifications Framework as well as an external review of Olds College to ensure our institution has the ability to deliver baccalaureate credentials.
 - Degree title change from the Agriculture Engineering System Technology Degree to the Bachelor of Digital Agriculture Degree

- **3.2.6.** <u>Course Revision BAS 4999 Directed Field Study</u> (J.Benkie)
 - The course description is being updated to ensure that students are fully aware that enrollment in BAS 4999 is contingent on full-time employment approved by the instructor. A minor change was made to the course materials to bring them up to date. Changes made to the GACs and competencies are to correct some grammatical errors and remove repetition. It is requested that these changes be made before the next cohort of students begins their DFS in the Spring 2022 term.

- **3.2.7.** <u>Course Revision COM 1030 Workplace Professionalism</u> (J.Benkie)
 - COM 1030 provides students with inter- and intrapersonal skills to operate successfully, collegially, and professionally in the workplace. In 2020, the provincial government mandated that postsecondary institutions offer Work Integrated Learning opportunities to all students. As COM 1030 is available to several programs across the College, the updates being proposed allow this course to act as a practical vehicle for incorporating Work Integrated Learning College-wide. This would be effective for September 2022 intake.
 - The intent is for students to actually be working within the course.

3.2.8. <u>Course Termination - EVS 2000 - Environmental Field School and Technical Reporting</u> (J.Benkie)

• This course will be offered one more time in the Fall of 2022 to finish off our current LWR students. Starting in the Fall of 2023 Land & Water students in the second year of the program will no longer take this course but will instead take a new technical writing course. The field lab components of this course are being moved back into the science and land courses that are scheduled in the fall of the second year.

- **3.2.9.** New Course Outline COM 2000 Writing for Environmental and Land-use Professionals (J.Benkie)
 - This course is being proposed to offer students a focus on technical writing specific to the Environmental/Land-use/Planning industry. It represents a significant rethinking of EVS 2000 and COM 1020, both of which will be discontinued from the program in Fall 2023.
 - The reconstruction and development of COM 2000 has strengthened from much of the industry feedback. This will continue to enhance learning experiences and to align to industry expectations.
 - This course was designed as more of a specialized COM 1020 course, with the preservation of as much of the COM 1030 and COM 1020 competencies as possible.

- **3.2.10.** <u>New Course Outline WIL 1500 Career Investigation and Field Placement Preparation</u> (*J.Benkie*)
 - WIL 1500 is a first-year Winter Term course and provides preparation for the required field placement. All LWR majors would take the prep course and it is a prerequisite for WIL 2500 (Field Placement). This course has been designed so that other programs could use the same format and make it specific to their industry needs.
 - Constructed this course generically enough as to ensure utilization in other programs if required.

3.2.11. New Course Outline - WIL 2500 - Industry Field Placement (J.Benkie)

The 14-week field placement would be embedded in a 3-credit course that would be offered in the spring and summer terms (May to August). Ideally, students would take the course in between the first and second years of the program; however, students could complete it after their second year. It would be a part of Land Use Planning, ESRP and Reclamation majors (SLM would complete their field placement in Year 2, Winter Term, embedded in their existing courses). Students would develop learning goals and complete reflective journal entries as part of the course. Students would be required to work the equivalent of full-time work for 14 weeks (minimum of 37.5 hours/week). LWR students are encouraged to find a paid position; however, they do not need to receive payment for the work they do. They could volunteer their time, or work in trade for room/board. Working overtime does not reduce the length of the work term. Faculty workload could be covered between two instructors to ensure adequate time off during the summer months. Successful completion of WIL 1500 is a prerequisite for WIL 2500. Instructor approval is required to ensure the student's employment meets the needs of the field placement. This course has been designed so that other programs could use the same format and make it specific to their industry needs.

3.3. School of Trades and Skills

3.3.1. <u>Program Reactivation - Pre-employment Heavy Equipment Technician</u> (D.Daley)

• A name change and program of study (Pre-Employment Agricultural and Heavy Equipment Certificate) was approved at the Nov 2019 AC meeting, but was never implemented and the PAPRS proposal was not sent, as a result of the decision from the government to suspend some of the activities. The former, and previously approved, Program of Study and Program Name are being taught currently and being brought back to Academic Council to ensure the College records are accurate. The program has been running since Summer 2020, thus the reasoning for a start date of Summer 2020.

3.3.2. <u>Program Termination - Pre-employment Hairstylist Certificate</u> (D.Daley)

- Intake was suspended for the Pre-Employment Certificate Hairstylist specialization at Olds College in Fall 2015 after declining enrollment in the previous 2 years (18 students in 2013-14, and 8 students in 2014-15) which made the costs of running the specialization prohibitive. The Pre-Employment Certificate - Hairstylist specialization remained active in PAPRS while the College determined broader strategic programming plans. In 2018, Olds College created a seven year strategic plan that aligned with our Provincial Mandate of being a college focused on agriculture and related fields within the province of Alberta. A review of academic programming alignment with our strategic direction suggested that the College should proceed with terminating the Pre-Employment Certificate - Hairstylist specialization as it no longer aligned with the institution's strategic direction. The Pre-Employment Certificate - Hairstylist specialization was offered to provide access to public and dual credit programming initially. After several offerings, demand for the specialization diminished and, being a revenue generating program, it was no longer viable to offer for the College.
