Start Right Away:		
1	Access your Student E-mail	Every Olds College of Agriculture & Technology student and employee has an official college e-mail account. E-mail accounts are generated upon enrolment in classroom instruction at Olds College of Agriculture & Technology.
2	Access your 'My Olds College' Account	Your "My Olds College" account is where you will view or update your personal information, view important dates and deadlines, see your timetable, final grades, and account balance, and be able to access tax forms or make credit card payments. Please refer to your Enrolment Confirmation e-mail for instructions to access this account.
3	Explore Student Funding Options	<p>Registered Alberta apprentices and occupational trainees may be eligible for financial assistance when attending the classroom instruction portion of their program. Student Aid Alberta provides loans and grants to apprentices registered in the Alberta apprenticeship program with Apprenticeship and Industry Training who are attending an approved classroom instruction program as a full-time student.</p> <p>The Federal Government provides apprentices registered in Red Seal trades with interest-free loans to assist with the cost of classroom instruction. See Canada Apprentice Loans, Grants, Tax Benefits for detailed information.</p> <p>If you have any questions in regards to funding or student loans, please contact Colleen De Jong, Financial Aid Advisor, at studentaccounts@oldscollege.ca or by phone at 1-800-661-6537.</p> <p>EMPLOYMENT INSURANCE & APPRENTICES: Apprentices are eligible to apply for EI. Your EI Code is available on the class registration letter in your MyTradesecrets account A copy of also provided in your Enrolment Confirmation e-mail.</p>
4	Plan your Living Arrangements	<p>Make the most of your college experience by living on campus. Apply now to live amongst your peers in a secure, fun, and supportive environment – plus it's super convenient!</p> <p>For students that are required to live off campus (TEP, families, pets), a list of resources is provided through the SAOC.</p>
5	Register for Accessibility Services	If you require academic accommodations, the earlier you register the better! Once you have been accepted into your program, it is a good idea to try and gather all the supporting documents you might need and complete the online registration form.
6	Book a Campus Tour	Come for a visit! Guided campus tours are available Monday through Friday, between 10:00am and 2:00pm. Taking a tour is a great way to explore facilities and campus.

7	Review your Equipment & Material List	<p>Please check your Admitted Student Section found at the very bottom of your program page for a list of equipment and materials.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Agricultural Equipment Technician; Heavy Equipment Technician; Landscape Horticulturist; Welder <p>Please ensure you note the preferred device. There are computer labs on campus and some devices may be available for loan from The Learning Commons.</p> <p>Refer to the Fee Schedule for an estimated maximum cost of new equipment and supplies. This cost is not included in your tuition and fees nor is it billed to your MyOldsCollege account.</p> <p>Information on required ILMs and any further supplies will be provided as you attend each class. ILMs are available from the Campus Store (Learning Resource Centre Building 15 at the bottom of the stairs).</p>
8	Complete your Online Orientation	<p>All students must complete the online orientation (and RESPECT Campaign). 9	Confirm your Program Tuition & Fees	<p>Fee payment methods are available at this link. Your fees are due the first day of classes.</p> <p>The fee schedule can be found here. 10	Confirm your SAOC Benefits	<p>Apprentices and Heavy Equipment Operator and Pre-Employment students are able to Opt-In for Health & Dental coverage.</p>

One Month Before Your Program Begins:

11	Confirm your Class Schedule	<p>Please plan on attending classes between 8 AM and 5 PM. Details regarding your fees and schedule will be available in your MyOldsCollege account approximately one week prior to your program start date.</p> <p>Further details will be provided by your instructors in your first class.</p> <p>Login to your MyOldsCollege account > Select the 'Student Services' Tab at the top of the page > Select "Registration" to view your timetable of courses > Select the timetable view that you prefer. (Student Timetable by Day & Time is most commonly used.)</p>
12	Obtain a Parking Pass	<p>If you would like to park your vehicle on campus, you are required to have a parking permit. Once you have applied for a parking pass, you can pay for and pick up your pass at the Office of the Registrar.</p> <p>Please make sure to return the parking pass to the Office of the Registrar for a fee refund if you will not be on campus for the remainder of the academic year.</p>
13	Request a Verification of Enrolment	<p>Verification of Enrolment forms are typically required to access RESPs.</p> <p>Verifications of Enrolment will only be issued one month prior to your program start date.</p>
14	Confirm Campus Dining Options	<p>There are a number of dining options available on campus.</p> <p>Meal plans are available at Elements Dining Fusion in Frank Grisdale Hall.</p> <p>Students living in Centennial Village are required to have a Meal Plan.</p>
15	Submit your Student ID Photo	<p>The Student ID card is used to identify you as an Olds College of Agriculture & Technology student. Your Student ID card is required to participate in a number of college activities and services.</p>
16	Understand your AIT Course Outline	<p>Select your trade and view your Course Outline under 'Supporting Resources'.</p>
17	Review your Add, Drop, & Withdrawal Deadlines	<p>Please e-mail apprentice@oldscollege.ca to cancel your classroom instruction before it has started. Our cancellation policy is found here.</p> <p>Please ensure you reach out to your Associate Dean (Paul Blankestijn pblankestijn@oldscollege.ca) and AIT Liaison Officer (Randy Gehring randy.gehring@gov.ab.ca) to discuss withdrawing from your classroom instruction after your classroom instruction has started.</p>
