Objective:

As a client-centered institution, Olds College of Agriculture & Technology (the "College") strives to meet the vehicle parking needs of all its client groups within available resources and space. The collection of parking fees and fines shall be applied to the continuous maintenance of parking lots, administrative supports and secondarily to assist in the development of parking lots for future needs.

To ensure access and to protect the safety of all, the College will allocate parking spaces and enforce their use in conjunction with laws and regulations related to safe transit and emergency access throughout the campus.

Policy:

Specific Guidelines

The College will make the necessary decisions related to the control of vehicles and pedestrians on College property including:

- 1. Parking Regulations
 - a. Establishing fees respecting the parking of vehicles and providing for the collection of those fees.
 - Governing the places where, the times when, and the conditions on which persons are authorized to park or prohibited from parking vehicles.
 - c. Authorizing reserved parking locations to persons, subject to the conditions within the procedures.
 - d. Providing the placement of signage or markings prohibiting or governing the parking of vehicles.
 - e. Deciding on the impoundment and removal of vehicles parked or left in contravention of the regulations.
 - f. Prescribing penalties including fines to be imposed for contraventions of regulations.
 - g. Providing for the hearing and determination of disputes arising in relation to:
 - i. Contravention of regulations, or;
 - ii. Imposition and collection of penalties under this policy.



	 2. Traffic Regulations a. Determining and posting speed limits. b. Prohibiting the entry of or restricting the direction of movement of vehicles. c. Requiring vehicles to yield or to stop and yield the right of way to other vehicles or pedestrians before proceeding. d. Pedestrian bylaws governing and prohibiting the crossing of and walking on roadways by pedestrians. e. The College will comply with current accessibility legislation and ensure provision of suitable parking areas is available for persons with disabilities.
