Olds College of Agriculture & Technology is located in the traditional territories of the Niitsitapi (Blackfoot) and the people of the Treaty 7 region in Southern Alberta, which includes the Siksika, the Piikani, the Kainai, the Tsuut'ina and the Stoney Nakoda First Nations. The area is also home to Métis Nation of Alberta, District 3.

Types of Work-Integrated Learning

Directed Field Study:

In the fourth year of an applied degree program, undertake an eight-month Directed Field Study, gaining in-depth industry experience.

Mandatory Professional Practicum/Clinical Placement:

If your discipline requires practice-based work experience for licensure or certification, our professional practicum placements will prepare you for your career.

Co-operative Education:

Alternate between academic study and work terms in a structured program, gaining valuable paid work experience.

Community Service:

Integrate community service with instruction to foster civic responsibility and enhance your learning experience

Field Placement:

Engage in a hands-on, short-term practical experience that aligns with your area of study. Field placements offer valuable insights and connections in your chosen field.

Internships:

Participate in a supervised, discipline-specific experience, allowing you to apply your knowledge in a professional setting.

Entrepreneurship:

Leverage resources and mentorship to develop business start-ups or address real-world needs while earning academic credit.

Applied Research/Capstone Projects:

Collaborate with host organizations, including Olds College, on real-world projects that enhance your problem-solving and critical thinking abilities.

Our industry-focused diploma programs offer hands-on learning experiences, led by seasoned industry experts. With work-integrated learning and a two-year completion timeline, these programs equip you with the skills, tools and knowledge for a successful career and lasting impact.

Post-Diploma Certificates: (1 year)

Geared towards students with a diploma or its equivalent, our one-year post-diploma certificate is perfect for recent grads in fields like business or science who want to level up their skills. It's also great for mature learners considering a career change.

Apprenticeships: (8 weeks per period)

As one of Alberta's leading apprenticeship training providers, we take pride in our century-long legacy of shaping skilled professionals. Our valuable industry affiliations grant access to cutting-edge equipment and technology, enhancing your hands-on experience. Guided by industry experts, our apprenticeship program equips you with essential trade skills.

Degrees: (2–4 years)

We offer degrees for various career paths. Choose from three applied science degrees: Horticulture, Golf Course Management and Agribusiness. These programs provide hands-on learning through one-year classroom study and one-year Direct Field Study. They require a recognized two-year diploma and focus on job readiness. Alternatively, consider our four-year Bachelor of Digital Agriculture for theoretical knowledge and critical thinking in agriculture technology.

Estimated Cost For Your First Year*

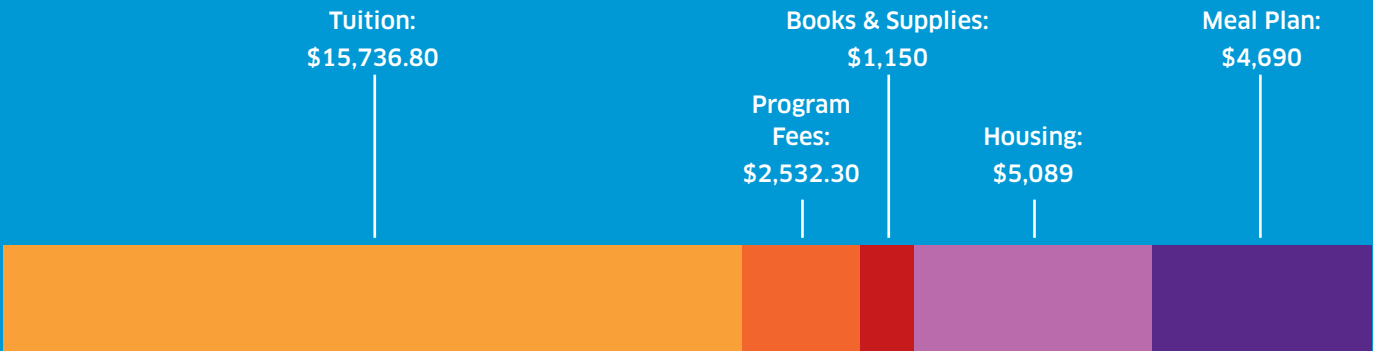
